### **Executive Summary**

The eQNet news dissemination builds on two strategies: diffusion of news through blogs with a multiplier effect and including news in the European Schoolnet's newsletter (diffusion about 3 000). Since eQNet has synergies with other EUN initiatives, such as the Learning Resource Exchange, it is convenient to canalise some of the news dissemination through these initiatives.

#### 1. Deliverable objectives

The eQNet news service is part of the overall dissemination strategy aiming to raise awareness about the project activities and results, and to reinforce networking between different initiatives in the field of digital learning resources for schools. The eQNet news dissemination builds on two strategies: diffusion of news through blogs with a multiplier effect and including news in the European Schoolnet's newsletter (diffusion about 3 000).

#### 2. eQNet News




Figure 1. The eOnet News blog on www.eqnet.eun.org

The eQNet news are published in the news blog on the project website: <a href="http://eqnet.eun.org/web/guest/community">http://eqnet.eun.org/web/guest/community</a>. The blog is publicly viewable to all, but only logged in users can contribute to it, making it sure that only authorised people write to the blog (Figure 1).

The news items vary from small news to teachers' network to more general posts about the project and its activities. There are currently more than 15 posts on the blog, all of which follow the same format that includes title, publishing data, author, and possibility to comment or rate the post. Additionally, tools are made available so that each reader can readily save the news item in their own social bookmarking site, such as delicious.

On the project website's front page, three (3) latest news items are displayed. Additionally, the blog has an RSS feed that anyone can subscribe to, so that the content can easily be syndicated to other platforms, websites or personal news-readers.





Figure 2. Some of the most viewed eQnet news articles

Some of the most viewed posts have more than 850 views (Figure 2).

The eQNet news are also diffused through the Learning Resource Exchange website: <a href="http://lre.eun.org">http://lre.eun.org</a>. The news section (<a href="http://lre.eun.org/node/13">http://lre.eun.org/node/13</a>) features a direct feed from the eQNet news blog.

Secondly, the items highlighted on the lre.eun.org home page are automatically published on the European Schoolnet website (http://www.europeanschoolnet.org/) with an "lre" tag.



Due to the renovation of the Learning Resource Exchange for schools portal (<a href="http://lreforschools.eun.org/">http://lreforschools.eun.org/</a>), the material available at lre.eun.org will form part of the new version of the LRE for schools portal in the future. Therefore, the eQNet news will be featured at the LRE for schools portal giving them.

#### 3. Sent newsletters

The main eQNet news have been disseminated to a wider audience through the European Schoolnet newsletter. The newsletter is sent out to about 3,000 recipients who are mainly corporate partners such as content developers, other stakeholders (e.g. repository owners= and policy makers, but also other European funded project teams, educational organisations and educational portals.
